INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGY

The Fund aims to track the performance of the Philippine Stock Exchange Composite Index (PSEi). The Fund shall substantially invest in stocks comprising the PSEi using the same weights as in the index.

CLIENT SUITABILITY

A client profiling process should be performed prior to participating in the Fund to guide the prospective investor if the Fund is suited to his/her investment objectives and risk tolerance. Clients are advised to read the Declaration of Trust/Plan Rules of the Fund, which may be obtained from the Trustee, before deciding to invest.

The BPI Philippine Equity Index Fund is suitable only for investors who:

- Are at least classified as aggressive based on their risk profile
- Have an investment horizon of at least five (5) years

KEY RISKS AND RISK MANAGEMENT

You should not invest in this Fund if you do not understand or are not comfortable with the accompanying risks.

Equity Price Risk: Investors are exposed to adverse changes in the prices of stocks listed in the Philippine Stock Exchange, which may be brought about by adverse stock market conditions, unfavorable company earnings and valuations and/ or negative developments in domestic and global political and economic conditions.

Liquidity Risk: Investors are exposed to the risk of loss due to the Fund's inability to convert security holdings to cash immediately or in instances where conversion to cash is possible but at a highly disadvantageous price due to limited buyers/ sellers in the market, low trading volumes or market disruptions, among other reasons/ factors.

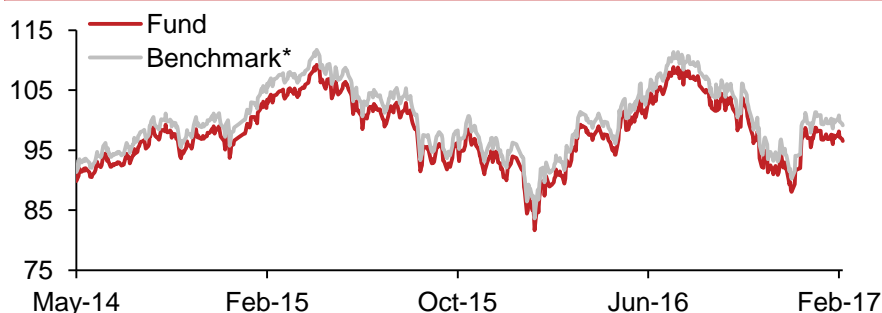

OUTLOOK AND STRATEGY

Market Review. The Philippine Stock Exchange index (“PSEi” or the “Index”) lost ground in February, slipping 0.24% to end at 7,212.09. After an impressive 5.7% rally in January, the market was ripe for profit-taking and consolidation. Lack of major news caused the market to stay within a range, with catalyzing headlines mostly stemming from specific companies and 4Q earnings.

Overseas, protectionist policy proposals from US President Donald Trump had an effect on global markets, with sentiment continuing to abstain from the local market. Currently, foreign investment in the Philippines has a YTD outflow position of roughly US\$100 million. Furthermore, strong US economic data gave consensus a reason to believe that the Federal Reserve will raise interest rates much sooner rather than later.

Top gainers for the month include LTG (+13.6%), SMC (+9.6%), and EDC (+8.1%). Worst performing index names include GTCAP (-7.3%), PCOR (-6.4%), and SECB (-6.2%).

Key Economic Developments:

- Inflation rose 2.7% in January
- BSP meanwhile kept rates unchanged, while raising inflation forecast to 3.5% (from 3.3%) in 2017 and 3.1% (from 3%) in 2018
- OFW remittances rose 3.6% in December to US\$2.6 billion, where remittances from the Middle East rose 4% and those from the US rose 15%
- US BPO firms, while still interested in expanding operations in the Philippines, are putting expansion plans on hold, according to PEZA Director General Charito Plaza

Fund Performance. The Fund registered a return of -0.26% for the month of February, underperforming the benchmark by only 2 bps. Year-to-date, the Fund registered 5.23%, underperforming the benchmark by 20 bps.

Fund Strategy. We look to stay defensive as the PSEi continues to consolidate, trading within 7,000 and 7,400 that is capped by higher chances of a FED rate hike. Dividend season is underway which will provide support on certain utility names. Banking sector to benefit on Fed rate hike and infrastructure boom. New IPOs may offer alpha as investors look for thematic plays rather than index names.

The following are among the Fund’s approved investment outlets, wherein the Trustee intends to invest depending on strategy, availability, or other market-driven circumstances:

- (a) Shares of stock of selected corporations, including convertible preferred stocks, which are already listed or being offered publicly and soon to be listed in the Philippine stock market.
- (b) Primarily short-term tradable fixed-income instruments, issued or guaranteed by the Philippine government or the BSP; marketable instruments that are traded in an organized exchange; investment outlets/ categories the BSP allow. Provided, that, a financial instrument is regarded as tradable if quoted two-way prices are readily available and regularly available from an exchange, dealer, broker, industry group, pricing service or regulatory agency, and those prices represent actual and regularly occurring market transactions on an arm’s length basis.
- (c) Primarily short-term tradable fixed-income securities issued, underwritten, or otherwise dealt by BPI and/or any of its subsidiaries, affiliates, their successors-in-interest or assignees, their directors, officers, stockholders, and related interest, and any of their trust and fund managed accounts, under such terms and conditions as the Trustee may deem to be in the best interest of the Fund or any such instrument as may be allowed under BSP regulations. Investment with related interests shall be in accordance with Subsection UX 410.12 (a) of the Manual of Regulations for Banks and Other Financial Institutions.
- (d) Bank deposits, BSP special deposit account or tradable debt instruments issued by the BSP.
- (e) Such other investments allowed under regulations issued by the BSP.
